Sparkling

Hild, Elbling, Upper Mosel, Germany, NV

Glass 12 Bottle 48

This unique area does not produce Riesling due to its limestone rich soil that extends into, as well as creates the stunning characteristics, of Sauvignon Blanc, from Sancerre and Chardonnay, from Chablis. If you could roll those two up into one sparkling wine, you'd have Hild's stunning Elbling Sekt.

Jousset 'Exilé,' Pétillant, Gamay/Grolleau, Loire Valley, France, 2019 (Rosé)

Lise and Bertrand source the grapes from gnarly old vines grown organically, outside of Maury. The grapes are hand harvested, foot trodden, and fermented in steel tanks with natural yeast. There is partial filtration, but does finish it's fermentation in the bottle for a lovely lingonberry aroma and finish. A fine introduction into pétillant naturel from two super amazing humans.

Baldini 'Montelocco,' Lambrusco, Emilia-Romagna, Italy, 2018 (Fizzy Red)

Baldini's "Montelocco," exemplifies the meaning "fizzy red." Made from organically farmed grapes vines, with just the right balance of sweet, savory, and carbonation.

White

Xarmant, Native Basque grapes, Txacolí de Álava, Basque Country, Spain

10 40 (porron)

Summer time means "Txacoli time!" Pronounced (chaw-ko-lee) this region of Northeast Spain specializes in crisp, naturally frizzante, wines typically enjoyed straight out of a pouring vessel called a "porron."

Brand 'The Electric Chardonnay Acid Test,' Chardonnay/Riesling, Pfalz, Germany, 2019

90% Chardonnay, 10% Riesling, 110% NOT WHAT YOU'D EXPECT. In a similar way the Ken Kesey Electric Kool-Aid acid test expanded people's thoughts, the Brand brothers combine these two seemingly ubiquitous grapes into a zippy, crisp, low alcohol treat. "Turn on, tune in, drop out."

Melon de Bourgogne, Pulpe Fiction, Muscadet-Sèvre-et-Maine, France, 2019

A partnership between Loire Valley legends, Lise and Bertrand Jousset & Nicolas Reau, who are also the "heart and soul" of the best natural wine fair in the world, Le Dive Bouteille, "Pulpe Fiction" takes them out of their home area and out to the west coast of Loire. Affectionately known as "Muscadet" and known for its mineral driven style perfect with oysters, or patio imbibing.

Red Tail Ridge, Chardonnay, Seneca Lake, Finger Lakes, New York, 2016

From our good friend, Nancy Irelan, who with her husband, built New York states first LEED certified winery. What comes from this winery is pure magic. Planted in the 1970's by Charles Fournier, at an elevation between 750-800 feet (Seneca Lakes elevation is 443 ft), sits on Honeoye Silt Loam, fermented and aged in oak giving it a subtle caramel apple aroma and macadamia nut. What's striking is how balanced the acidity is to the overall weight of the wine.

Orange

(Quick explanation: White wine grapes where the skins were not separated from the pressed juice and left on during the fermentation process, resulting in it's color and texture.)

Tchotiashvili, Kisi, Kakheti, Georgia, 2016

The country of Georgia IS the birthplace of winemaking with historical analysis dating production of grape fermentation to 5600-5300 B.C. The ancient method of fermentation in underground Qvevri, provides a unique color, texture, flavor, to be contemplated and marveled. Kakha Tchotiashvili makes his wines without any additives to the wine, nor chemicals in the vineyard. Akin more in flavor to a great cup of white tea, with spiced fruit, and hints of herb. It's been a source of pride that our guests have expressed so much interest and found so much enjoyment with the wines from Georgia. Guamarjos!

Rosé

Nadler, Zweigelt, Niederösterreich, Austria, 2019

This vintage of Nadler is fresh, lively, floral and typifies the phrase “rosé all ze day!” Pick a few bottles up for your next picnic, or day at the beach.

Reds

Guillot-Broux, Gamay, Mâcon-Cruzille, Burgundy, France, 2017

Appellation Macon-Cruzille is located in France's Burgundy region. However, you will never find a Pinot Noir in sight. Gamay is the only red grape permitted to grow here. Guillot-Broux is one of our absolute favorite producers in Burgundy, due to their historic commitment in not using commercial herbicides and pesticides. A stunner!

Bow & Arrow ‘Rhinestones,’ Pinot Noir, Willamette Valley, Oregon, 2019

Scott Frank combines some of the most highly prized grapes, from Johan Vineyard, to “Rhinestones” that tastes closer to a Loire Valley Pinot Noir/Gamay blend, or Passetoutgrains, from Burgundy, than anything I've tasted from the US. Enough here, for Pinot purists, with loads of contemplative nuances for the wine equivalent of one Hercule Poirot.

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Rimbert ‘Les Travers de Marceau,’ Languedoc-Rousillon, France, 2018

Jean-Marie Rimbert left his home in Provence to eventually own his own vineyards in the Languedoc. Located in the Saint-Chinian AOC, at its highest point, Berlou, possessing schist rich soils perfect for growing Syrah and Carignan. There's a generous amount of Mourvèdre in this vintage. A profile of smoke, olive, and mint, provides endless food pairing potential.

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Orsi ‘Posca Rossa,’ Emilia-Romagna, Italy, 2019

Federico Orsi co-founded Mercato della Terra, a farmer's market in Bologna. He didn't set out to farm vineyards and make wine, but the bug bit him when a local Bolognese vineyard came up for sale. He steadily began converting his vineyard to organic farming and utilizing minimal intervention. “Posca Rossa” is Orsi's multi-grape blend that captures the spirit of the Emilia-Romagna's abundance of world-class food products.

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Chateau Grolet, Bordeaux blend, Côtes de Bourg, Bordeaux, France, 2017

Bordeaux does not need to come from a Grand Cru Class Chateau, cost thousands of dollars, and need half a lifetime to be enjoyable. In fact, I hate this has become the overwhelming belief. La Grolet is Demeter certified and the pureness of fruit expresses this in spades.

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APERITIF/AROMATIZED WINES (4 oz)

More commonly referred generally as “vermouth” these are not only used for classic cocktails. Also apertifs; or simply, lovely, lower alcohol alternatives.

The differences occur when one uses a specific botanical.

Vermouth uses wormwood; Chinato/Quinquina uses quinine; Americano uses gentian

Sherry, Fortified, Oxidative & Dessert Wines (2.5 oz)

- NV Bodegas Yuste, Palomino Fino, Manzanilla Sanlúcar de Barrameda, Andalusia, Spain** 6
Yuste adopted a 19th century solera with his own to produce a complex and beguiling Manzanilla, between 8 and 10 years of age. This comes from keg and not bottle, so the Sherry “purest” can’t complain that it’s not “fresh.”
- Henriques & Henriques, 10 year Sercial, Madeira, Portugal** 11
H&H is the second oldest producer, in Madeira, and the oldest to continuously maintain their vineyards, since 1850. Unlike other Madeira producers, H&H only uses 100% varietal. Sercial provides mouthwatering acidity, apricot, and nuttiness. If you are looking for a Manzanilla Sherry, try this. Madeira keeps indefinitely, so that freshness today will be there tomorrow! A perfect pairing with oysters.
- Quinta do Infantado, 10 year Tawny Port, Portugal** 14
João Roseira is such a meticulous vigneron, the quality of the grapes are so high quality, he can use 30% less brandy than others in the area. This, as well as using small boxes to haul grapes to the winery post harvest, eliminating broken berries which causes oxidative flaws, creates a less syrupy port.
- 2013 Quinta do Infantado, Late Bottle Vintage Port, Portugal** 10
Even with Port, we will only seek out producers that are ethical. The Roseira family has owned their vineyards since the 19th century, and are still run by the family today. A reflection of Gontelho’s unique terrior along the Douro River, this ruby has been bottled unfinned and unfiltered.
- 2016 Château La Rame, Sémillon, Sainte-Croix-du-Mont, Bordeaux, France** 14
Sainte-Croix-du-Mont sits directly west across the Garonne River from it’s more famous neighbors Sauternes and Barsac. However, at their finest, the wines rival the two in quality. There is no equal when it comes to price! Bright, fresh, without being overly cloying and syrupy. Refreshing on a hot day.

BEER•ON DRAFT

- Stiegl, Goldbräu, Austria [5% 12 oz]** 6
Affectionately known as “Salzburg liquid gold,” this full bodied, golden lager is sessionable like a lager, with the flavor of an ale.
- Around the Bend ‘Villianous,’ American IPA, , Wisconsin [6.3% 12 oz]** 7
One yeast strain just wasn’t enough, “Villianous” uses FOUR! Two British and two West Coast strains combine to one Super strain. More nuanced than your standard IPA, which are still present, look for subtle apple and clover honey notes.
- War Pigs ‘Foggy Geezer’, Hazy India Pale Ale, Verona, Wisconsin [8.0% 12 oz]** 7
This collaboration with local favorite 3 Floyd’s and Denmark’s, Mikkeller, is a hopbomber’s dream come true. Bright, juicy, citrus and peach; dank and the firm bitterness you’d expect. Ben Rossi approved!

CIDER•SAKE~IN CAN

- Graft ‘Farmer’s Flor,’ Unfiltered Dry Table Cider, New York [6.9% 12oz]** 6
Unfiltered cider from New York apples and barreled in Spanish cedar, French and American oak to add a toasted edge without losing the crispness.
- Bushido ‘Way of the Warrior,’ Junmai Ginjo Sake, Kyoto, Japan [18%, 180mL]** 12
This clean, refreshing sake is a great representation of traditional Junmai Ginjo style; watermelon rind, pear and tart berries.
